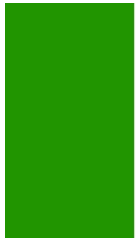

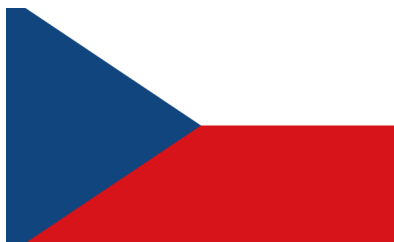

- Professor Mislav Ante Omazić, because he was so kind and comprehensive, so friendly with the Spanish students. He was also very good in the subject, the best teacher in my opinion.

Did you socialize with Croatian students?

- Not much. They didn't socialize either.

Did you like Zagreb and Croatia? Why?

- A lot. I found Zagreb a little bit cold, but I had plenty of things to do everyday and a lot of free time. The country is amazing, I wish I'd had more time to see everything. The landscapes and the coast is incredible, some of the most beautiful beaches I have ever seen, and the weather not so bad. People are really nice and helpful, and everybody speaks English, which makes everything easier.

What type of accommodation did you find?

- I had to find an apartment to share with people I didn't know. I really don't recommend it. It is much better and you enjoy more in a student dorm. You have to book it very soon, because also Croatian students have the right to choose it first (what happened to me). If you decide to share an apartment, it is better to do it in the second semester, when you already know everyone and you can choose your flatmates.

Do you consider the cost of living in Zagreb high or low?

What did you consider here as cheap and what as expensive?

- Zagreb is relatively cheap. Accommodation is relatively cheap. Eating in a restaurant is really cheap, also buying in the supermarket. Eating in the faculty is extremely cheap (due to student cards discount). Travelling near Zagreb is also very cheap, but, however, travelling to your home is really really really expensive. Clothes and electronic stuff are very expensive too.

Where was the best place to eat?

- I went to so many places I don't even remember the names. In the street where all the bars are (near Main Square) you can find many places (Ulica Ivana Tkalčića) and also in Ilica street. Some of my favorite places were Nokturno, Submarine, Kava Tava, Curry Bowl, Umami, Rocket Burger, Ožujsko pu, Leonardo, Paulaner...

- I went out a lot. I visited the city center (is not very big, but you can take very beautiful photos anywhere). I had a lot of coffees with my friends (the culture of coffee is very strong in Zagreb, and also very cheap). I travelled as much as I could.

The prices in the supermarkets are the same but the prices at the food markets are really low. Also going out for dinner or going to the cinema, for examples, is cheaper than in Germany.

- For students at the Menza. It is very cheap and for the price it is totally ok. Sometimes the dishes surprised me in position of taste.

- The fact that you meet people from all around the world and that you can see countries and cities you would never have seen if you hadn't stayed abroad.

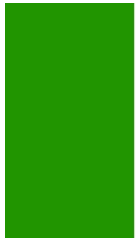
Your feedback on the work of the Internatioanl Office:

- Croatian students were always helpful but it is rather difficult to socialize with them on more 'advanced level' when there are so many events organized only for Erasmus students.

Did you like Zagreb and Croatia? Why?

- Zagreb is a good place to live in. It is smaller than some capital cities but in the same time it always offers something to do (cultural events, parties etc.). I love travelling around Croatia as there are many places to visit and enjoy on students' budget.

Where was the best place to eat?

- Basta restaurant and Submarine.

What type of accommodation did you find?

- I've found my first flat before (July 27) I came to Zagreb (October 2017). I asked the landlord to show me the flat and himself on Skype, we exchanged the copies of our IDs and signed the contract before I sent money in advance. I recommend all new students to do exactly the same, otherwise in case of any troubles you're hopeless. Always have agreements on paper (by printing-signing-scanning of course)! You can always ask for advice local ESN members. After I prolonged my stay in Zagreb for the next semester it was way easier to find a new apartment because I already knew the city and what I need. Unfortunately, prices for foreign students will be always higher than for locals but you can always find something on your budget or in needed location.

Do you consider the cost of living in Zagreb high or low?

What did you consider here as cheap and what as expensive?

- The cost of coffee/beer/food in restaurants (also eating in Menza)/accommodation is lower in Zagreb than in my country. Transport/travelling/tickets for museums or must-see places is higher.

Where was the best place to eat?

- There is a large number of good places. The most popular: Leonardo, Nokturno, Ožujsko Pub, Mr. Moo. And if you are completely broke after partying then Menza will save your life :)

How did you spend your free time?

- Museums, cinemas (movie festivals are very well prepared for non-Croats!), parties, ESN trips, travelling with friends/alone, enjoying Croatian slow life with local people.
