<p>ABOUT ZAGREB</p>	<p>Zagreb is an old Central European city. It lies on the intersection of important routes between the Adriatic coast and Central Europe. For centuries it has been a focal point of culture and science, and now of commerce and industry as well.</p> <p>When the Croatian people achieved their independence in 1992, Zagreb became a capital - a political and administrative centre for the Republic of Croatia. Zagreb is also the hub of the business, academic, cultural, artistic and sporting worlds in Croatia. Zagreb is a city of green parks and walks, with many places to visit in the beautiful surroundings. The city will enter into the third millennium with a population of one million. In spite of the rapid development of the economy and transportation, it has retained its charm, and a relaxed feeling that makes it a genuinely human city.</p> <p>Location: northern Croatia, on the Sava River, 170 km from the Adriatic Sea</p> <p>45° 10' N, 15° 30' E, situated 122 m above sea level</p> <p>Population: 779.145 (2001.)</p> <p>Surface area: 650 sq. km.</p> <p>Institutions: The University, 10 theatres, 21 museums, 14 galleries, 12 art collections</p>
<p>ACCOMMODATION</p>	<p>RESIDENCE HALLS</p> <p>The Ministry of Science, Education and Sports allocates a number of rooms to foreign students in one of the five student residence halls in Zagreb.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Residence hall Cvjetno naselje, 1750 beds Odranska 8, tel. 6191-245 ➤ Residence hall Stjepana Radića, 3550 beds Jarunska 2, tel. 3634-255 ➤ Residence hall dr. 	<p>There are four student dormitories that are open to domestic and international students. The rooms in the residences are double or triple (there are no single rooms) and sometimes have their own bathrooms. In other cases bathrooms will be shared by the residents of the same floor.</p> <p>PRIVATE HOUSING</p> <p>For those who are not assigned university accommodation it is necessary to look for alternatives such as private rental accommodation. Rents vary greatly according to location, room size, facility etc. Overhead expenses are sometimes included in the price, and sometimes are paid by the consumer. Payment is usually expected at the beginning of the month, while some landlords request payment for several months in advance. The easiest way to rent a room or a flat is to run an advert in a newspaper or in the classified ads e.g. „Plavi oglasnik“.</p> <p>Examples of prices: Single room with shared kitchen and toilet – 100 – 150 Euros per month Studio apartment – 200 Euros per month</p> <p>STUDENT HOSTELS</p> <p>If you prefer private accommodation and would like to live in a rented flat, before choosing a nice one, you might want to spend some time in a hostel. <p>ENTRY TO CROATIA</p>	<p>Passport or some other internationally recognised identification document which proves your identity and citizenship, issued by governmental authorities of your home or resident country is required to entry in the Republic of Croatia. Tourists may remain in Croatia for up to three months.</p> <p>VISAS</p> <p>Visa is required for the foreigners coming from the countries whose citizens require a visa for entering Croatia. Visa is a permission to enter, stay or travel through the territory of the Republic of Croatia.</p>

	<p>A foreign citizen is required to get a visa before entering the Republic of Croatia, in accordance with the visa system prescribed by the Croatian government.</p> <p>Visas are normally issued by the diplomatic mission or the consular office of the Republic of Croatia. <p>HEALTH INSURANCE</p>	<p>Foreigners, who have compulsory insurance in their home country, have the right to emergency health service during they stay in Croatia.</p> <p>All foreigners must have a health insurance during their stay in Croatia. The best option is to enrol in an insurance plan from your home country that covers your stay in Croatia.</p> <p>The foreigners who decide to take out a Croatian health insurance policy can do so at the Croatian Health Insurance Institute (Hrvatski zavod za zdravstveno osiguranje-HZZO).</p> <p>Croatian Health Insurance Institute Klovićeva 1, 10000 Zagreb www.hzzo-net.hr</p>
