

Dr. Ria Ivandić is a Lecturer in Political Economy at the University of Oxford and a Researcher at the London School of Economics and Political Science. She is also a Fellow at Harris Manchester College (University of Oxford) and a Visiting Fellow at the University of Zagreb. She obtained a PhD in Economics from the Department of Political Economy at King's College London in 2019, and previously an MSc in Economics from the Barcelona Graduate School of Economics (Universitat Pompeu Fabra). Her research interests are political economy, labour economics and applied econometrics.

She is one of the investigators on a UKRI funded research project on the 'Outreach to Domestic Abuse Victims in Times of Quarantine'. Dr. Ivandić has worked on a number of policy-oriented analysis and research projects for institutions such as the Home Office, All-Party Parliamentary Groups (APPGs), the National Crime Agency, and many more. Her work has been cited in newspapers such as the Guardian, The Telegraph, the BBC and the Economist and in parliamentary debates on policies around domestic abuse.
